Prayer Triads

During the seasons of Lent and Easter (February 26th through May 30th) we are inviting our church members and friends to sign up for prayer triads. Groups of three will meet five times during these 95 days to share about their lives, reflect briefly on a passage of scripture, and pray together for each other, the church, our community, nation and world. The meetings are designed to be 60-75 minutes

long. An outline for the time together will be provided and will include an opening prayer, guidance for sharing with one another, a scripture to ponder, and suggestions for a prayer time together.

Acts 2:42 gives something of the scriptural rationale for these sharing times. Speaking of the life of the early church, and the spiritual practices in which they engaged, this verse says, “They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching, to fellowship, to the breaking of bread in worship, and to prayers.” These prayer triads include pondering scripture (the apostles teaching), sharing together about our lives (fellowship), and praying for each other, the church and world (prayers). These are important practices for invigorating both our lives and our life together as the church.

Ash Wednesday Worship Service

We will do an Ash Wednesday worship service in the sanctuary on February 26th, 7 p.m. The service will include songs, prayers, scripture and litanies, a short message and the imposition of ashes. All are welcome to participate in this annual worship service as we begin the season of Lent.

Lenten Study Series/Dinner Church Worship

(Each Wednesday from March 4th
through Wednesday, April 8th)

Beginning on Wednesday, March 4th (note the change of date from last newsletter) our Lenten Study Series will actually be a series of “dinner church” worship services. First century worship services were actually around a potluck meal. We will seek to recover that ancient practice during these six weeks together. As we eat, we will reflect on the theme “Gaining Sight on the Journey.” We will follow Jesus and his disciples through three chapters of the gospel of Mark as they begin working their way toward Jerusalem—and the events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. This section of Mark (8:14-10:52) begins with Jesus healing a blind man (though the recovery of sight happens in stages) and ends with Jesus healing another blind man. These bookend healings suggest that the stories and teachings of Jesus sandwiched between are about the gradual and ongoing process of gaining sight or

insight regarding Jesus, God, the will of God, and the ways of God. As we eat and worship, we will share together our thoughts and insights seeking to hear God in Mark’s stories and in one another’s reflections and stories. All are welcome to join us as we gather around tables in Parker Hall for these “dinner church” meals and worship times at 6:30 p.m. each Wednesday during Lent. Please bring a potluck dish to share. The Church Matters

When I ask people what they think of the church, they often express deep appreciation for the congregation in which they gather for worship and community. Their congregations, they say, are welcoming, justice oriented, caring, and giving. They describe being embraced in times of personal difficulty and grief, and of finding deep friendship and places where they can serve, learn and grow.

When I ask them what they think non church goers believe about the church in general, their answers are not always affirming. To be sure they describe a church that reaches out to others, that tries to meet the needs of the communities in which congregations sit, and that wants to be engaged with their neighbors.

But they also describe a place that is considered by people who do not know the church, or who know the church to be a

place of pain and hurt rather than a place of solace. That church is judgmental, hostile, sex-obsessed, a mess, and irrelevant.

I believe that the church matters and that what happens in our congregations and among our ministries can make a difference in the lives of people. I believe that in these days of national division and decline in our churches that God expects us to speak to the issues we see in a way that is both prophetic and pastoral. This is not a time for fear; it is a time when God is calling us to be people of courage, to take heart and to live unafraid.

Hebrews 10:37-39 says:

"For yet 'in a little while, the one who is coming will come and not delay; but my righteous one will live by faith. My soul takes no pleasure in anyone who shrinks back.' But we are not among those who shrink back and so are lost, but among those who have faith and so are saved."
