

One of the ways we can love each other is by taking this seriously and doing our utmost to not only avoid contracting this virus ourselves, but also to ensure that we do not inadvertently spread it to a particularly vulnerable person in our circle of family and friends. We are indeed our brothers' and sisters' keepers. We are all connected as children of God...and within our church we are connected as the family of God, the Body of Christ, and have great responsibility for one another's well-being.

A big problem with this virus is that we can be carrying it with no or few symptoms or very mild symptoms...and pass it along to others. Authorities say that they do not know the sources of two-thirds of the cases...which means it is spread through the community without people knowing the persons around them are infected.

One of the two persons who have died in Sacramento County was a member of a church in the Florin area. Five other people in her church are infected with the virus. As children of God, as followers of Jesus, we are under a moral imperative to seek to protect each other.

In light of this, board chair, Jeanelyse Doran, and I are recommending we immediately suspend in-person worship services...and try to do most of our studies and meetings online via Zoom. We do not do this lightly. We love being together with all of you on Sunday mornings and during study times. You are our family, the human connections that give us strength and help us keep going. But love calls us to take these steps for one another's well-being.

Jeanelyse found these words, a lament, from the Rev. Adam Bradley who was our interim pastor while Larry was on sabbatical a couple of years ago. These are the words Adam wrote and shared with his congregation in Cherry Log, Georgia:

The Lament of a Pastor:

I don't want to close the doors of the church, for what good is an open table without anyone to sit at it.

I don't want to tell my people not to gather, not to embrace, not to put themselves at an intimate distance from one another - because to put yourself right alongside a sister or brother is the very work of Christ.

I don't want to record my sermon on my phone and post it on a webpage, because the Spirit lives and moves in the physical space between my spoken word and your sacred ears.

I don't want to call you instead of coming to sit at the side of your hospital bed, because sometimes the only comfort to be had is when you see me seeing you.

I don't want to live in the wilderness of Lent in the comfort of my own home, I'd rather be uncomfortable with you in the Lord's house. I don't want to close our doors for a week or a month in a world becoming more and more secular, because I'm afraid they might never open again...

But the God we worship and praise isn't about giving me what I want, but demanding from us to seek justice, love kindness, and to walk humbly in the presence of God.

If we can't do that in the midst of social distancing, for the good of our most vulnerable, then we weren't the church anyway.

In my lament, remember your mercy, O God.

Both Jeanelyse and I resonate with what Adam has said. We don't want to cease to worship together, but feel it is the way to love this church, to love one another at this time.



Here is what we plan to do:

- Jay Surdell, Jeanelyse Doran, Steven Wong and I will gather in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings at 10 a.m. and we will live-stream a worship service via Zoom. Jeanelyse will send you information about how to access zoom. You will receive an email with a highlighted link to a Zoom account. You click on that, and then enter the meeting number which will also be in the email...and you will be able to see and hear us as we lead worship. You can enter the Zoom meeting from either your computer or I-Phone. Steven will also record the service and will make it available either from our website or through an email sent to you. Hopefully most of you will be able to access this live-stream or the delayed version. Now, while we strongly encourage you to stay at home, we will not lock the doors of the church on Sunday morning, but if you do come, please observe the protocols of hand sanitizing at the front door, keeping at least six feet away from each other (social distancing), covering coughs and sneezes, no handshakes or hugs, etc. Also, please stay home if you are sick—fever, sore throat, runny nose, cough.
- We will do meetings and Bible studies via zoom...and maybe even just set it up for times to chat with one another so we can just see and hear each other.
- Karen Webber and I have begun work on a phone tree which will mean you all should get a phone call each week just checking in to see how you are doing, to see if you need anything...and to see if there are ways you can help others out.
- Beja is thinking about ways to connect our children during this time...and has

already set up a plan for a Zoom Sunday school this coming Sunday.

- And, of course, you all can just pick up the phone and call any of us at any time (well, maybe not any time—I'm usually asleep around 3:00 a.m.) just to visit. Texting and Facebook posting and emailing are also ways to keep us connected during this time of social distancing.
- I will also try to write, on a somewhat regular basis, a message to all of you on Facebook and also send it via email to those of you for whom I have an email address.
- I will also try to make a lot of phone calls...and please call me if you need anything. I may be working from home, so you can reach me at 666-2069 or at the church phone number, 662-9356.
- Both Greg and I will be working our full hours, but will be doing most of that work from home...or in a locked church. Please feel free to contact us whenever you need to.

Social distancing does not have to mean isolation. We just need to work a little harder, and in different ways, to stay connected as the Body of Christ.

Some Thoughts from Jeanelyse Doran

Hello Church Family,

Pastor Larry is right. Today in surprising ways I learned social distancing may require physically distancing but it does not require social disconnection. In fact, today I learned how our deep need for social connection transcends physical distance.

I had to pick up a prescription today. I did not realize Corner Drugs is closed to the public even though they are still very much taking care of the community. If you pick up prescriptions, they will be delivered to you at the curb. There were a number of people waiting outside the door. We all maintained physical distance, even greater than the required six feet. Yet, slowly, as we waited, we began conversations.

We talked about how strange it all felt, people being afraid of each other (I hoped they meant the virus, not each other, but I was not at all sure,) and we shared ideas for resources and where things could be purchased. We shared a need to connect, to be of service, and to be seen. We did connect socially in ways we might never have done had we been able to walk into the store and stand in the accustomed line.

Later my phone buzzed signaling I had messages. Another group I connect with through a Zoom conference call had decided to share pictures or moments of beauty we encountered throughout the day. We are scattered like dandelion seeds across Northern California, Washington, Oregon, and one member just recently moved to Indiana.

Yet all day long we shared moments of beauty and social connection across the physical distances. Some of the images, poems, or reflections helped me to connect more deeply with myself and others connected me to them in ways we might have never known.

I trust and pray if we keep taking the faithful steps of physical distance, we will find new imaginative ways of connecting more deeply to each other and to what God may be calling us to now.



HISTORY CORNER

JOHN H. PASANEN, IWA JIMA SURVIVOR

John H. Pasanen, longtime member, Associate Pastor and scholarship recipient of this church was a survivor of the battle of Iwo Jima in 1945.

The 75th anniversary of the battle of Iwo Jima was marked this February,

Sharon Armus and Wanda Freeman, church historians, reviewed information contained in archives found in the Marven Suggett History Room and interviewed Shirley Pasanen, widow of John, and survivor of the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941.

John was born in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan near Lake Superior. Both John's and Shirley's families migrated west for war-related jobs. John dropped out of high school to join the Marines. He was an outstanding athlete in his community having been scouted by the Detroit Tigers and later by the Brooklyn Dodgers.

The young high school dropout as a private first class in H Company 3rd Battalion, 26th Regiment, 5th Marine Division landed on the black sand to spend six days on the island surrounded by carnage and terror. He promised God that if he got off Iwo Jima alive, he would become a minister. He witnessed the flag-raising on Mount Suribachi by men he knew. He was hit by three bullets one of which hit his pitching arm.

After John's recovery, he completed high school, received a bachelor's degree from San Francisco State and attended Pacific School of Religion.

John and Shirley were married, had three bright and talented daughters, cared for foster children and hosted two or three exchange students.

John was Associate Pastor of Woodland

Christian Church from 1960 through 1962, near the end of Karl Irwin's ministry and the beginning of the ministry of Robert Neal. He worked with the youth and was definitely a 'people person'.

During the sixties, a scholarship committee was formed by members of the church in order to help John complete a Bachelor of Divinity. About 45 people contributed to the funds to cover tuition at Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis, Indiana. John was ordained on June 5th, 1966.

In 1985, John returned to Iwo Jima to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the battle and delivered a simple prayer on the spot where the flag was raised.

John became a teacher, counselor and principal of the continuation school which was later named Cache Creek High School. John officiated at weddings of students. He often counseled families seeking comfort and also officiated at funerals and/or burials. He was much loved and respected.
