Love NotesBy Pastor Larry Love

I hope as you are preparing to celebrate Christmas that you remember there are twelve days of Christmas...and that you don't think Christmas begins on the Friday after Thanksgiving nor on December 14th (the twelfth day before Christmas) but on December 25th and continues for twelve days through January 5th before we move into Epiphany on January 6th.

Having clarified that little bit of Christmas information, let's tackle some other Christmas traditions with a little Christmas quiz:

- 1. There are four gospels in the New Testament. Which two include stories of Jesus' birth?
- 2. What time of year was Jesus born?
- 3. How did the very pregnant Mary get to Bethlehem?
- 4. What gifts did the shepherds bring?
- 5. What animals surrounded the baby in the manger?
- 6. How many wise men were there?
- 7. Where did the wise men find the family?
- 8. In 1846 Queen Victoria and Prince Albert popularized what Christmas decoration by displaying it in Windsor Castle?
- 9. What real life fourth century Christian bishop is behind the Santa Claus tradition?

Answers:

- 1. Matthew and Luke. Luke tells the beloved story of the journey to Bethlehem, Mary giving birth unsheltered and using a manger for Jesus' bed, and angels appearing to shepherds who then visit the newborn Jesus. Matthew tells the story of an angel appearing in a dream to Joseph telling him to take Mary as his wife and the story of the wise men coming to pay homage.
- 2. We do not know the date of Jesus' birth. The Romans celebrated the winter solstice on December 25th and the church took over that celebration in the fourth century as Jesus' birthday. It's a very appropriate date for us in the Northern Hemisphere because it's the darkest time of the year and Jesus is spoken of as a light that shines in the darkness. It reminds us that God has a habit of breaking in at the darkest of times.
- 3. Mary probably walked. There's no mention of a donkey.
- 4. There's no mention of shepherd gifts...not even a song from a little drummer boy.
- 5. No animals are mentioned in Luke.
- 6. We do not know. The tradition of three comes from the mention of three gifts: gold, frankincense and myrrh.
- 7. In a house. (Matthew 2:11)
- 8. The Christmas Tree. In ancient times evergreen boughs were hung in homes during the winter solstice to express hope that spring would come soon and once again green shoots would burst forth. Christians used greenery to symbolize new (and everlasting) life in Christ
- 9. Saint Nicholas. He was known for giving anonymous gifts to the poor. Simply change Saint to Santa and shorten Nicholas to Claus and you have Santa Claus.

I love Christmas with its traditions—Santa Claus, lights, trees, wreaths, caroling, pageants...and presents.

Even more, I love the underlying story and the message it declares. In Isaiah 64:1 the prophet cries out to God, "Oh that you would tear open the heavens and come down...." It's a plea for help, a prayer that God would come and set things right.

We Christians believe that God did just that, tore open and heavens and came down to set things right, in the birth and life of Jesus of Nazareth.

One biblical writer put it like this, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace." (John 1:1, 14, 16)

In the baby of Bethlehem, the message of God, the message God had been trying to communicate in different ways for thousands of years, the message that God really, really loves us and wants us to thrive, that message became flesh, embodied in a flesh and blood human being.

In Jesus of Nazareth, we see the will of God most clearly revealed. We receive precious gifts like love, peace, hope, forgiveness, newness of life. More than that, we see what God is like because the one born is the very image of the invisible God. No wonder we celebrate so

heartily for twelve days...and more. Praise be to the living God who tears open the heavens and comes down.

A Men's Bible Study is Starting Up January 20, 2021!

The Office of Disciples Men has released its second set of study materials for congregational ministry with men—"The Jesus Way – The Bible." The Jesus Way is a 24-week study by the Men's Ministry for the Disciples of Christ that introduces the underlying principles of living life modeled after Jesus. By the title, you can see that this resource focuses on the Bible, how it came to be, what it consists of, how to study it, and ways to apply its teaching and wisdom to your life, the Jesus way! This resource is divided into five units of five sessions each:

The Bible – What Is It?

The Bible - 1st Testament

The Bible – 2nd Testament

The Bible – The Letter to the Philippians

The Bible - The Psalms

The section on the 2nd Testament focuses on the Gospels. The section on The Letter to Philippians uses this letter as a template for studying the letters of Paul. The section on The Psalms introduces us to the beauty and power of some of the most beloved passages of the Bible.

This study is designed to help men engage the Bible as the tool of faith it was created to be. It takes away the mystique that sometimes hinders the Bible's approachability and opens up the this vast, vital and essential resource for men seeking to live life the Jesus way.

This new study will begin Wednesday, January 20th, at 1 p.m.
