We are in a political season that invites us to measure love of country by the way we vote.

It is Regional Assembly season for many Regions of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). For their love of the church members of our church are gathering across the United States and Canada in fall meetings. I will be attending the Regional Assembly of the Pacific Southwest, my home region October 19-20. I am looking forward to seeing friends and to learning how another Region of our church gathers for worship, renewed community, learning, sharing tables of food, and gathers at The Table with one another.

And in many of our congregations, it is Stewardship season, a time when our love of God and the church, and our gratitude for the ministry of Jesus, and our part in it is made visible through our offerings. How do we share love in this season? There are at least four ways.

 Commit to doing at least one act of mission beyond the doors of your congregation. I know many of you already are doing so. Thank you for bearing witness to the love of God in community.

- 2. Write into your congregation's budget ongoing support for Disciples Mission Fund. DMF is the source of income for the whole church and as is true of giving in your congregation, the financial health of the Disciples depends on congregational giving to the Disciples Mission Fund. 35% of funds given to DMF are returned to Northern California-Nevada.
- 3. Receive the Christmas Offering in your congregation by Christmas Sunday December 23. The Christmas Offering is one of the six Special Day offerings received and shared by the Disciples. 100% of the funds given to the Christmas Offering will remain in our Region.
- Give to the Regional Fund. Formerly called the Annual Fund, these over and above gifts given by individuals and families help to maintain the quality of ministry in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

Your gifts and the love and encouragement you show to the Regional staff and the ministry we do together help to strengthen us to develop leaders from every generation, celebrate that our part of the body of Christ is open and inclusive, and that in our broken world, we will continue to be a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world.

WHY I GIVE to MY CHURCH

As a newer member of Christian Church of Woodland, I wondered when I first came whether I should donate. This is my perspective.

First, my faith comes from experience. The Bible is the ONLY book where I heard God talking to me. Yes, I read other so called "bibles" but God did not talk to me through them. In fact, one of the new age religions' so called bible was just a mental "mind trip", it made my head hurt.

But in my hour of need, when things got really bad on the East Coast, and I had no one to turn to, I receive a Bible from my sister in Hawaii. It was the Wayward Bible. I opened it on the very day I was exposed to racism in the Federal Government. God talked to me and I understood him very clearly. He gave me explicit instructions on how to handle a racist supervisor. As I continued following his instructions, I began to understand. My Father was talking to me, and boy did I appreciate it. So, when a Bible study appeared at my 55+ community, I went and gave a little.

When I continued to listen to God and pray to Jesus, I was brought here, across the nation, to the Christian Church of Woodland. I knew from the moment I went into the church for the first time, I was home. I listened to the gentle guidance from our Father, and I started giving more. Well, it took me 6 months to get job here in Sacramento (tough competition from the U.C. grads). Plus, there was pressure to move closer to my fiancee (to move to Arizona or New Mexico), and finances were really tight. But I continued to pray, and as I came to church regularly, my Father indicated to me again and again, that he wanted me here at this Church in Woodland.

So, I gave more and became more involved in the Church going to Bible study, and choir practice. Then my prayers were answered. I got a decent job. With that, I increased my giving to the church listening to guidance from our Father from the Bible and the Worship Service. As I go deeper in being a disciple of Christ, I'm moving into a life of service, Hospice, Church, my job, and service to the Woodland community. I'm so grateful for all our Father has done for me.

My next step is to bring my future wife into this church, and I'm pretty sure I don't know all of what my Father wants me to do, but I do know I'll give more and more because I love God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit.

Giving more is basically saying to God, I love you, and I want to serve you more and more, and well, that to me is the life of this Christian as a Disciple of Christ.
